The CFPUA COVID Relief Program provides financial aid to pay for residential CFPUA bill charges incurred after January 27, 2020, and through October 15, 2021, that are delinquent as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The application for financial assistance can be completed at CFPUA.org/Relief. Customers unable to apply online may call the Good Shepherd Center, which is administering the program, at 910-763-4424.

You will need your CFPUA account number ready to complete this application. To find that number, please have your most recent CFPUA bill on hand.

# Apply for financial assistance with your CFPUA bills

## Skip the mailbox with faster billing options



The U.S. Postal Service recently changed its standards for first class mail delivery, allowing for longer delivery times. For customers who pay their CFPUA bills by mail, this may result in paper bills being delivered later and payments taking longer to reach CFPUA.

CFPUA offers numerous alternatives to paying your bill by mail, including via Autopay, online, by phone, and in-person:

- Online Customer Self-Service: Register for a free online account at <a href="www.CFPUA.org/Online">www.CFPUA.org/Online</a>, using the account number and online activation code found on your CFPUA bill.
- Autopay: Pay bills automatically by bank draft or credit/debit card. To
   enroll in automatic bank draft payments, complete the form at this link. To
   enroll in automatic credit or debit card payments, create an online account
   at www.CFPUA.org/Online.
  - NOTE: CFPUA's payment vendor charges a \$3 convenience fee per \$300 increment for credit or debit card payments. Customers can avoid the convenience fee by paying by eCheck through their online CFPUA account.
- One-time online payments: Make a one-time online payment using Quick-Pay using your credit or debit card.
- Pay by phone: Call 910-332-6550 to pay your bill using CFPUA's Interactive Voice-Response system (IVR).
- Pay in-person: Visit CFPUA's Customer Service Centers at 235
   Government Center Drive or 305 Chestnut Street between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, and Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
   Thursdays. Payments can be made at the counter, at CFPUA's payment

kiosks, or through the drop-box (only check or money orders accepted through the drop box).

## Raising the roof at the Sweeney Plant



Crews at CFPUA's Sweeney Water Treatment Plant are capping off the facility that will soon hold the plant's new deep-bed Granular Activated Carbon filters.

This month, contractor Adams Robinson began installing the precast roof for the <u>Sweeney Treatment Enhancements Project</u>, which will significantly increase the plant's ability to remove PFAS such as GenX from water sourced from the Cape Fear River.

This part of the project required 30 flatbed trucks delivering 67 hollow-core, precast panels and seven precast double tees, which are lifted into place atop the facility using a 350-Ton truck crane. Roof installation is scheduled to be completed in early February.

Completion of the roof means crews can move on to installing electrical and mechanical systems on the upper level of the new facility.

#### **Extreme Makeover: Pump Station edition**



CFPUA recently wrapped up projects to beautify a pair of wastewater pump stations.

Pump stations are a key part of our community's sewer system, with many located in neighborhoods throughout New Hanover County to help move wastewater across our region's flat terrain. Hewletts Creek Pump Station (Pump Station 34) sits along Pine Grove Drive just south of its intersection with Greenville Loop Road. Bradley Creek Pump Station (Pump Station 35) is located along Oleander Drive near the Bradley Creek bridge.

Both stations are highly visible from the road and needed better integration into their surrounding neighborhoods. Improvements to the two sites include screening, painting, and landscaping, as well as adding a paved parking area at Hewletts Creek station.
