maintenance operation conducted by thousands of water utilities every year. During flushing, water is forced through pipes at high velocity and systematically flushed out of the fire hydrants, removing accumulated sediment.

Each Monday, CFPUA will publish maps of neighborhoods to be flushed in the coming week on this webpage.

Flushing does not impact the safety of drinking water, and CFPUA does not anticipate issuing boil water advisories as a result of the program.

Customers may experience periods of low pressure and/or water discoloration while flushing is being conducted in their areas.



In warmer months, the average household uses more than half of its water outdoors. The biggest drain on summer water bills: Watering the lawn.

Even on the warmest days, good irrigation habits curb water waste while keeping your grass and garden healthy:

- ♦ Follow the recommended irrigation schedule above
- Avoid watering when the sun is up; sunlight and heat increase evaporation
- A Regularly check your sprinkler system for leaks
- ♦ Get a rain barrel for outdoor irrigation
- ♦ Let your lawn grow slightly longer to shield soil and keep it moist



Briefly describe your typical day at work: I conduct research on properties CFPUA needs to acquire for different projects or on property CFPUA already owns or has an easement. Then I prepare the offer packages and negotiate with property owners to complete the purchases. I also work with customers who seek to obtain variances for

things like fences to be placed in CFPUA-owned easements. Recently, I began handling claims and am learning something new about that process daily.
