Beat the heat with smart watering! 🔷 🔅





With near-record temperatures hitting our area, it's extra important to practice good watering habits. Follow these rules of thumb to keep your lawn healthy,

conserve water, and save money on your CFPUA bill:

- ♦ Set sprinklers to run overnight; evaporation during hot, sunny hours can steal up to half your water.
- ♦ Let your lawn grow slightly longer to shield the soil and keep it moist.
- ♦ Check your lawn by stepping on it; if the grass springs back, it doesn't need water.
- A Regularly check your sprinkler system for leaks.
- ↑ Take advantage of the rain! Your lawn needs just an inch of water per week to stay healthy; turn sprinklers off for a couple of days before and after rain.

CFPUA Awarded State Loans for Southside Replacement Project



Our Southside Plant Replacement Project was one of 60 projects across North Carolina selected this month for funding assistance by the State Water Infrastructure Authority (SWIA).

Gov. Roy Cooper's office announced that CFPUA was approved for up to \$35 million in low-interest loans to help fund the project, which will replace the Southside Wastewater Treatment Plant. Located on River Road and serving about half of CFPUA's customers, the Southside Plant opened in 1972 and is nearing the end of its useful life.

With construction costs estimated at \$250 million, this is the largest capital project in CFPUA's history. We appreciate this assistance from SWIA and the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality, which will reduce costs associated with the project and allow us to pass the savings along to CFPUA's customers.
