



This Holiday Season, Cease the Grease!



It's the busiest cooking season of the year, and we're reminding customers to keep fats, oils, and grease (FOG) out of the drain.

Sewer spills caused by FOG and materials like wipes don't just harm the environment, they cause expensive wear and tear across our community's wastewater system. Luckily, there are simple steps you can take to protect the environment and help CFPUA keep rates low:

- NEVER pour FOG down the drain. The same goes for lard or shortening, dairy products, batters, dressings, icings -- really any cooking waste.
- Use a drain strainer to catch food scraps in the sink.
- Scrape plates into the trash before washing them or placing them in the dishwasher.
- Collect used cooking oil in a jar or can. Once cooled, dispose of oils in the garbage can. You can even pick up a free "Cease the Grease" lid cover at CFPUA's customer service centers!
- **NEVER flush any product other than toilet paper**. Wipes (even those labeled "flushable"), paper towels, sanitary products, diapers, Q-tips, dental floss, food wrappers, and other trash should all go in the garbage.



CFPUA is excited to bring back our Portable Water Station!

This station provides a place to fill water bottles with clean, fresh water during community events. CFPUA can provide the station to outdoor events hosted within our service area in Wilmington and New Hanover County. Requests are processed on a first come, first served basis, and there is no cost to request the station.
