CFPUA Board Approves FY 2025 Budget

The CFPUA Board this month approved the organization's fiscal year 2025 (FY25) operating budget, which totals \$120 million, a 6.3 percent increase over the FY24 budget.

Current Job Opportunities

Under the FY25 budget, the average residential customer's monthly bill for combined water and sewer services will increase by \$3.38, or 4.6 percent, starting with services delivered July 1, 2024.

Major drivers of the FY25 budget include:

- Increased costs related to CFPUA's efforts to address Chemours' PFAS contamination in the Cape Fear River. Read more here.
- Work to replace CFPUA's
 Southside Wastewater
 Treatment Plant (SSWWTP).
- Water and sewer utility location work related to internet providers adding buried fiberoptic cable in New Hanover County.
- New personnel positions, including a laboratory supervisor and Engineering Services staff.

President Biden's Wilmington Visit Highlights Funding for Service Line Replacments



Our staff was honored to be a part of President Joe Biden's historic visit to Wilmington this month, celebrating funding for American water systems to remove lead service lines.

Under recent changes to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule (LCR), every public water system is required to survey pipes across their systems for the presence of lead. CFPUA got a head start on this process back in 2020, surveying about 10,000 water service lines in the oldest parts of our service area.

To date, our survey has found zero lead service lines, but has identified a few hundred galvanized lines. These older lines have a higher likelihood of having a lead "gooseneck" connector, so CFPUA is replacing them all.

Much of the funding for this work will come from \$4.16 million in grants and loans that CFPUA has secured from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, administered by the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ).


Ahead of the president's visit, staff from EPA and NCDEQ joined CFPUA for a live demonstration of a service line removal. Our crew removed a lead gooseneck from a home's water service in downtown Wilmington, installing a new water service line at no cost to the homeowners.

CFPUA is well positioned to complete our service line inventory by the October 2024 deadline. We are grateful for our state and federal partners for helping fund this important work and joining us this month to celebrate our progress.
